1.1 Visa and residence permit

The main factors which determine whether you need visa to Hungary or not are your nationality and the expected length of your stay.

Since Hungary is a member state of the European Union, citizens of EU and EEA (European Economic Area) countries are not required to have a visa in order to enter. The only documentation they are required to have is a passport or identity card.

Non-EU and non-EEA citizens must apply for a resident visa for study purposes at the nearest Hungarian Embassy or Consulate.

What to do:

1. Citizens of the EU and EEA:

Students from EU and EEA (European Economic Area) countries must report their address and apply for a registration certificate in Hungary after getting registered at school.

Citizens of the following countries must apply for a residence permit within 30 days after arrival:

Andorra, Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Brunei, Canada, Chile, Costa Rica, Croatia, Guatemala, Honduras, Iceland, Israel, Japan, Liechtenstein, Malaysia, Mexico, Monaco, New Zeeland, Nicaragua, Norway, Panama, Paraguay, Republic of Korea, Salvador, San Marino, Singapore, Switzerland, Uruguay, USA, Venezuela

For detailed information, please, contact your embassy or consulate or the **Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade.**

2. For students with a VISA:

Resident visa for study purposes is to be obtained before departure from your country. Among others, you must present:

- Letter of Acceptance from BME
- proof of payment of the tuition fee
- proof of your accommodation in Budapest
- passport valid for minimum 30 days

The process takes minimum two weeks. The visa will be valid for 30 days only, and after your arrival in Budapest you will have another 30 days to apply for a residence permit (after registration at the university). Obtaining a visa may take months. Be prepared for it!

1.2 Scholarships



Covering tuition fees and living expenses for two or four years, Hungarian State Scholarships offer you access to an unparalleled experience in graduate education.

The **Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship** is a programme for foreign students, founded by the Hungarian Government in 2013. The programme aims to promote cultural understanding, economic and cultural relations between Hungary and other countries.

The **Scholarship for Christian Young People** is a programme, founded by the Government of Hungary in the spirit of its solidarity policy towards persecuted Christian minorities.

Both programmes offer

- no tuition fee
- monthly stipend
- dormitory access or additional contribution to accommodation costs
- health care services according to the relevant Hungarian legislation

1.3 Healthcare



Medical care *for citizens of the European Economic Area* (EU, Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein and Switzerland) is provided on the basis of the European Health Insurance Card. The citizens of these countries are entitled to receive the same treatment under the same conditions as the residents of the above countries.

In case of *foreigners studying in Hungary*, entitlement to health care services in Hungary is restricted to those foreign nationals who pursue their studies full-time at an institution of secondary or higher education and whose student status is based on an international agreement or a fellowship granted by the Hungarian Ministry of Human Capacities.

First aid and emergency medical care are free for foreigners.

1.4 Insurance

Stipendium Hungaricum Scholarship Programme provides you with health insurance during your studies. You can sign a temporary health insurance policy for the first semester after registration at BME. During the first semester, you need to apply for your permanent health insurance, covered by the scholarship programme. For more info about this process, refer to the TAJ card page of the International

Mentor Team.

Fee-paying students can apply for the Studium health insurance package of Generali Insurance Co. which covers the cost of care and the necessary medical treatment resulting from diseases or accidents. The company also covers 50% of the price of purchasable medicine prescribed by the doctor.

Except for emergency treatments, the insurance company covers the cost of only treatments which are carried out by **Szent Kristóf Szakrendelő** Kft (*1117 Budapest, Fehérvári út 12.*) or hospitalisation ordered by this health centre.

The Studium health insurance package does not cover:

- hospitalisation due to childbirth and any complications of illnesses or
- accidents that occurred prior to the starting date of the insurance period
- the costs of dental treatment (except those resulting from accidents), medical attendance of pregnancy, abortion (unless it is medically reasonable), cosmetic treatments, rehabilitation and psychiatric diseases, tapering-off treatments, diseases caused by HIV, alcohol or drug abuse and medical examinations required for a health certificate.



1.5 Hungarian Bank account

If you are a Stipendium Hungaricum scholarship holder, you are required to open a Hungarian bank account where your scholarship will be transferred to.

To open a bank account, you must present:

- your passport and another identification document (such as driver's license, tax card, etc.)
- o student card, which is proof that you're a student at the BME
- valid residence permit and address card



3.1 Internet at BME

How to manage your Neptun finances

If you think a fee has been unrightfully imposed, please submit the **"007 Opposition to payment obligation**" request through Neptun.

Submit the **E111 Request to examine money transfer to Neptun account** request if you transferred money to the Neptun account, but you still can't see it after 3 working days.

3.4 Student Card



1. Go to the Government **Customer Service Office** ('Kormányablak' in Hungarian) in *Budapest, 11th district, Bocskai Street 39-41.* (office hours: M:7-17, Tu:8-16, W:12-20, Th:8-16, F:814)

Before you go:

- check your personal data in Neptun (first name, family name, mother's name, city of birth, date of birth)! You have to give the same data as in Neptun.
- > you must have a permanent (home) address in Neptun!
- ➤ take your passport to identify yourself

At the Reception:

- press the button 'Diákigazolvány/NEK adatlap'
- a photo will be taken of you, and your data will be recorded
- you will be given a form (NEK Adatlap), keep it for later use in Neptun

2. Applying via Neptun

- > under "Administration" choose "Student Card request"
- click "Add new"
- In the opening window enter the barcode (called NEK-azonosító) in capital letters it is in the upper right corner on your data sheet you received in the Customer Service Office
- select the equivalent "Demand type" and your permanent address at home for "Street address"
- close the window by clicking the "Save" button

3. you can request a **'Temporary Student Certificate'** (valid for 60 days) until you get your permanent Student Card

- enter your temporary address (in Hungary) into Neptun under My data/Contact information/Addresses/Add new
- submit an "E066 Request for temporary student certificate" at Administration/Requests/Available request forms and click Submit request at the bottom.
- As a cause of the Covid-19 pandemic, these certificates are now issued digitally, with a digital signature. You can **download them** from the Attachment of your E066 request.
- the certificate is valid for 60 days and you have to submit a new request for a new one!

3.5 Student certificate or transcript of records

A (excellent) equals grade 5 (excellent)
B (very good) equals grade 5 (excellent)
C (good) equals grade 4 (good)
D (satisfactory) grade 3 (satisfactory)
E (pass) equals grade 2 (pass)
F (fail) equals grade 1 (fail)

According to the governmental decree on the introduction of the credit system 1 ECTS credit corresponds to student workload of 30 hours.

4 STUDENT LIFE

4.1 Sports Center



BME GTK

Venue: BME Sports Complex (1117 Budapest, Bogdánfy u. 12.), close to building Q.

In line with BME's mission and tradition, physical education and sports are a priority and our goal is to make physical activity part of university life.

The organisational unit responsible for the coordination of Physical Education at the University is the BME Fitness and Sports Center. It also provides the professional background for organising traditional university and faculty championships and cup competitions.

Students can use BME's sports facilities outside their Physical Education classes (for a fee) and they can inquire about the possibilities at BME Fitness and Sport Center (*Budapest XI., 4-6 Bertalan Lajos Street; Room 113*).

Information on Physical Education and competitions can be found on the website and on the Facebook page of the BME Fitness and Sports Center. We encourage everyone to visit the facility to make it easier to choose a sport. During the physical education classes, the practice material of the given sport is applied in the form of trainings. We offer a choice of nearly 30 different sports (courses).

Free sports opportunities: athletics, football, basketball, volleyball.

Sports for a fee of 6000 HUF/semester: tennis, squash, ricochet, badminton, table tennis, body building, spinning, indoor climbing, ice-skating, Krav Maga, aikido, boxing, Iaido-jodo, women's self-defence, dancing, aerobic, TRX, functional circuit training, yoga.

4.2 Library

BME operates the largest technical library in the country, known as OMIKK.



It supports high-quality education, scientific training, research, development and innovation in the fields of engineering, technology, natural sciences, business and social sciences. Besides supporting knowledge management, it also serves as a community space, fostering efficient learning and research. As a public national reference library of technology its mission is to provide access to information in all the above-mentioned fields. BME OMIKK undertakes to collect, preserve and disseminate documents and objects

representing the traditions, the past and the present of the University. Furthermore, it wishes to promote Hungarian and global culture by using the widest possible variety of library tools.

It can be found behind the K-building. In order to use the library, you have to register in the library building. The registration is easy and it does not take long. You have to show your

residence permit and your student card. Exchange students can use the library but cannot borrow books.

Service fee: HUF 10-12 (using printers of the library, A4 size, single/double-sided)

Today, Student Research Societies represent the most significant structure for the management of emerging talent in the Hungarian higher-education system.

5 LIVING IN BUDAPEST

5.1 Currency



Forint (HUF) has been the local currency in Hungary since August 1946. It was named after the city of Florence, where golden coins had been minted since 1252.

Banknotes come in denominations of 500, 1000, 2000, 5000, 10,000 and 20,000. All of them are watermarked, contain an embedded vertical security

strip of thin metal and are designed to be suitable for visually impaired individuals. Six different coins are in use: 5, 10, 20, 50, 100 and 200 forint coins.

You can also open a bank account, as the non-residential account service is designed especially for foreign nationals. All you need is your passport. You can open a HUF or any other currency account.

Please note that the prices listed are guidelines, not actual prices. The actual costs of living depend on your personal preference and financial means.

5.3 Public transport in Budapest



Budapest has an efficient network of public transport, including bus, trolley bus, tram, metro services plus suburban railway lines called HÉV lines and boat services. Passes are available for various lengths of time (eg. monthly) and are valid for each form of transport – metro, bus, tram, trolleybus, boat – within the boundaries of Budapest. Single tickets that can be used on any form of transport are also available at metro stations or street kiosks. They are valid for a single

journey without transfer on the whole length of a line (within the boundaries of Budapest), which means multiple tickets are needed when your journey involves changes. Bus drivers on specific routes do sell tickets but passengers need to prepare exact amounts as no change will be given back. If one regularly uses public transport, it is economically more viable to buy a monthly or yearly pass. Students are entitled to reduced rates. For current ticket types and prices, visit BKK. Holders of a valid student card are entitled to discount fares.

Tickets:

- Single ticket: 350 HUF
- Block of 10 tickets: 3000 HUF

Passes:

- Monthly Budapest-pass for students: 3450 HUF
- Quarterly Budapest-pass for students: 10350 HUF
- Semester pass for students: 16200 HUF
- Discounted annual Budapest-pass for students: 37800 HUF

Additionally, single tickets are available from the bus driver onboard at the price of 450 HUF.

Public transportation in Budapest virtually ends after 11pm, when the metro, trams and trolley buses stop operating. There are some night buses running (marked with "É"), but not as frequently. Tram lines 4 and 6 runs all night.

Trains

Most train lines in Hungary use Budapest as a central point, which is the most common place for transfers. Although the train network has lines connecting cities and towns, to reach your final destination quickly, it is sometimes faster to travel through Budapest. Budapest has **three major train stations**: the Eastern Railway Station (Keleti pályaudvar) and the Southern Railway Station (Déli pályaudvar), both of which are situated at stops along metro line M2 (Red Line), and the Western Railway Station (Nyugati pályaudvar), which is situated on metro line M3 (Blue Line). **Related website:** <u>MÁV-Group</u>

Interurban and international bus services

If you travel outside Budapest, you can also take a coach. Coach drivers sell tickets on the coach, but to secure seat reservations, the tickets should be purchased in advance. **Related** website: <u>Volan Bus</u> or <u>Flixbus</u>

By car

Visitors don't need a Hungarian driving license to drive in Hungary but they need to keep all car documents, their driving license and passport with them. If they are stopped by a traffic warden or a police officer, some form of identification including these documents will have to be presented and driving without any documents is an offence. Speed limits in Hungary vary according to road types. In urban areas the speed limit is 50 km per hour, on highways it is 90 km per hour. If you drive on a motorway, the speed limit is 130 km per hour and you have to buy a motorway vignette. You can get it mainly at petrol stations. It costs HUF 2,975 per week for passenger cars. Renting a car is also possible if you are 21 years old or older and have had your driving license for at least a year. Most car suppliers require an international driving license as well. **Hungary has a zero tolerance policy towards drink-driving.**

Taxi

When taking a taxi, tourists should avoid hailing unmarked taxi cabs. Even if they have a taxi sign on the roof and are seen standing at taxi ranks, do not get in the car unless they have a company name on the outside of the car. You can always hail a taxi in the streets but it is cheaper to book one over the phone. From September 2013 every taxi is uniformly yellow in Budapest.

MOL Bubi



The MOL Bubi public bike-sharing scheme is an environmentally friendly, quick and convenient alternative in urban transport in Budapest, which consists of 156 docking stations and 2,071 bicycles. Different types of tickets and passes as well as redeemable coupons provide access to the system.

You can use MOL Bubi:

- with a quarterly, annual or a semi-annual pass
- using a 24-hour, 72-hour or 7-day ticket
- every day around the clock

You can become a MOL Bubi user if you pay the access fee to the public bike-sharing system: buy a **24-hour, 72-hour or weekly ticket** or a **monthly, quarterly, semi-annual or annual pass**. Pick up a bike from any docking station with the help of the terminal or the sensor on the rear-side of the bike or by using the MOL Bubi mobile app. Click here for details.

Tipping

Hungarians normally give tips when eating out, having a drink at a bar or when using a taxi. The tipping etiquette is 10% in case of a proper service. However, many restaurants an extra service fee to your bill, therefore check it prior to paying. In that case you don't have to leave any extra tip. Taxi service is also up to 10% if the service was satisfying.

6 IMPORTANT TO KNOW

NO DRUGS!

All recreational drugs are illegal in Hungary, moreover, the purchase, consumption, and possession of illegal drugs are all criminal offences. Even if the use of a particular drug is not a criminal offence in your country, you are still obliged to comply with Hungarian law, and will be held accountable to the same standards as a local person. You can learn more from the European Monitoring Centre for Drugs and Drug Addiction (EMCDDA).

SPEED LIMITS

The speed limit for cars and motorcycles on the motorway is 130 km per hour (approximately 80 mph) on highways, the limit is 110 km per hour (approximately 65 mph) and in town and village areas the speed limit is 50 km per hour (approximately 30 mph)

IMPORTANT RULES

Hungary has a zero tolerance policy for driving under the influence. It is against the law to use a hand-held cell phone while driving anywhere in Hungary and seat belts are mandatory for everyone in the car.

ELECTRICITY

Before travelling to Hungary, you should bear in mind that mains sockets may be different from those in your home country. This problem can be easily solved with a universal adapter. The voltage is 220V AC, 50 Hz, sockets are two forked.
